## **Food Service News**

All student lunch accounts have been updated, and any balances left from last year have been rolled over to the 2016 - 2017 school year. Check your students balance at <u>www.payforit.net</u>. If you have questions, please call the Foodservice Office at 330-877-4742.

**Free and Reduced Lunch applications** are now available online. Login with the same account as you now can use to complete student online forms. *(See related article about our new school online forms on page 4).* 

Click on the "Lunch Menus" button on the school website home page, then click on the "lake.sdms2.com" link on the "Lunch Menus" page. It will direct you to the online process. *When submitting your application, you'll get instant notification regarding your eligibility status*. This streamlines and expedites this application process.

The elementary buildings (K-5) lunch price is **\$2.50/day**. At elementary buildings, in addition to the daily lunch menu we offer pizza, fresh made salads, hot dogs and peanut butter and jelly sandwiches. Please send in money to deposit on your

student's lunch account. Please call our office to limit a student's purchases or to inquire as to what they are buying. Milk is .50 cents but is included in any lunch meal.

At the middle and high school (6-12), the lunch price is **\$3/day**. We offer freshly made salads, deli sandwiches, and a special item of the day each day. We also offer pizza every Monday and Wednesday, pepperoni calzones every Tuesday and Thursday, and baked subs every Friday. Milk is .50 cents but is included with any lunch combo.

Lunch menu for August 23, 2016 for grades K-5 is; Chicken Nuggets, Spinach Salad, Seasoned Fries and Milk. The menu for grades 6-12 for the first day of school is; Chicken Tenders, Fries, Broccoli with Cheese, Applesauce Cup and Milk.

Online payments require a *credit card, your e-mail address, and your student's ID number*.

## Vaccinations Required before School Starts

Immunization requirements for school attendance in Ohio have changed, requiring that all Lake seventh graders and seniors receive immunizations *before school starts Tuesday, August 23, 2016.*

All incoming seventh graders in the fall of 2016 are now required by Ohio school law to show proof of the following immunizations BEFORE the first day of school. They are:

- TDaP vaccine (to protect against Tetanus, Diphtheria and Pertussis)
- Meningococcal (A, C, Y, W-135) vaccine (to protect against Meningitis)

Any seventh grade student who has not had TDaP and Meningitis (A, C, Y, W-135) vaccinations will not be permitted to attend school until proof of these immunizations or alternative requirements according to Ohio Revised Code section 3313.67 have been received by the school.

Both the required TDaP and Meningitis (A, C, Y, W-135) shots can be obtained at any time from now until the first day of school. Contact your Primary Care Physician or the Stark County Health Department (Ph: 330-493-9914) for an appointment.

Meanwhile, all incoming seniors are required to receive the Meningococcal (A, C, Y, W-135) vaccine (to protect against Meningitis) before school starts.

If your student received a Meningitis (A, C, Y, W-135) vaccine before age 16, a second dose is required for school attendance in twelfth grade.

If your student will be receiving the first dose of Meningitis (A, C, Y, W-135) vaccine and is now 16 years of age or older, only one dose is required for school attendance in twelfth grade.

Any senior who has not had the required Meningitis (A, C, Y, W-135) vaccination will not be permitted to attend school until proof of this immunization or alternative requirements according to Ohio Revised Code section 3313.67 have been received by the school.

The Meningitis immunization can be obtained at any time from now until the first day of school. Contact your Primary Care Physician or the Stark County Health Department for an appointment.

Don't wait!

As soon as these required immunizations are obtained, please provide a copy of your child's shot record, including the Meningitis vaccination dates, to Lake Middle School or Lake High School so your student's record can be updated. Visit the school website homepage at <u>www.lakelocal.org</u>, and see a "District News" item to view downloadable letters to parents of seventh graders and seniors. Both letters include a form that parents can use to submit the vaccination record.

## School Facilities Update

Following is the latest information concerning our school facility project, including what will be happening in the immediate future:

- Beginning the first week of September, construction site work will begin at the Lake/Hartville complex, the future site of our 2 6 building
- During September, the existing playground at Uniontown Elementary will be moved to the back of the school building
- New classroom furniture will be piloted in kindergarten, third grade, and fifth grade classrooms our students will offer input and comments on choices available!
- Phase I development of State Route 43 athletic fields has been completed and grass has been planted; use of fields by community and school athletes can tentatively begin in late 2017
- Beginning this year, bus routing at Lake Middle School and Lake High School will be changed, and parking for Lake High students will be adjusted, in anticipation of site work, which will begin early spring, 2017. More details will be forthcoming soon!
- Tentative occupancy of Hartville/Lake Elementary: fall, 2018
- Tentative occupancy of southern new extension of Lake High School: fall, 2018
- Tentative occupancy of new/remodeled construction at Uniontown Elementary: TBD
- On a related note, as of August 1, 2016, **Pat Carroll** assumed the role of Assistant Superintendent, while **John McAllister** became Lake's Facility Project Manager.



## **Traffic Alert**

#### New Construction Near Lake/Hartville Elementary Will Impact Traffic

Construction for our new intermediate building for grades 2-6 will soon begin. Our new building, slated for completion by 2018-19, will be located behind the present Lake/Hartville complex and it will greatly impact traffic and parking patterns.

The construction zone will be fenced off for safety, and staff parking for Lake Elementary will be moved to the west end of the complex and occupy 70 spaces. The remaining spaces will be used for visitor parking.

Buses will lineup on Belle Street and Lincoln Street both in the morning and at dismissal. Student drop off in the morning will be at the west end of the Lake/Hartville complex with all students entering Lake Elementary through door 6. Parents dropping students off will only be able to enter the west parking lot from Lincoln Street.

Parent pick for both Hartville Elementary and Lake Elementary students will be at the end of the school day AFTER buses have departed at approximately 3:30 p.m. at their respective building main entrances. We strongly encourage parents to have their children ride the bus to and from school during the school year!

Allowing your child to ride to the bus will provide the following benefits:

- Fewer parent vehicles will greatly reduce traffic congestion around the Hartville/Lake Elementary complex
- Fewer parent vehicles will allow Hartville/Lake staff to more efficiently and safely monitor students
- Bus ridership provides convenience and saves parents time
- Bus ridership saves parents money spend less on fuel
- Bus ridership saves wear and tear on your vehicle
- Bus ridership saves an average of more than 1 million pounds of CO2 emissions per state per year
- School buses are designed to be safer that passenger vehicles in avoiding crashes and preventing injury



• Students are much safer riding the school bus than being driven by a parent; they are about 20 times more likely to arrive at school safely if they take the bus.

The schedule for students attending Lake and Hartville Elementary will remain the same as last year. Students will be released from buses at 8:35 a.m. Students arriving after 8:45 a.m. will be tardy. At the end of the day, students will be dismissed to buses at 3:18 p.m. and depart from the school by 3:25 p.m. Bus routes for all Lake students will be posted on the school website, <u>www.lakelocal.org</u>, by the middle of August 2016.

These are exciting times as we begin the journey to provide our students with 21st Century schools. We hope to reduce inconveniences and obstacles to parents, students, and staff to ensure a successful, exciting school year!

## **Transportation News**

#### Bus Schedules and Routes

Children should be at bus stops five minutes before the normal pick up time. Please allow extra time for the bus ride to/from school during the first several days of school. During the first two weeks of school, parents are asked not to bring students to school or pick them up at the end of the day unless absolutely necessary. This helps the students learn which bus they will be riding. This year, due to school construction, we ask you to consider not driving your child to/from school. Let them ride the bus.

#### **Teach Children**

- Safe walking practices to and from the bus stop.
- To wear light colored or reflective clothing when going to and from the bus stop in darkness.
- How and where to wait safely for the bus
- What to do if the bus is late or does not arrive.
- What to do if you are unable to be home when your child arrives (have PLAN B in place).
- How to enter and leave the bus safely.
- How to safely cross the roadway before boarding and after leaving the bus.
- Respect for rights and privileges of others.

## **Complete Required** Students Forms Online!



#### **Designated Bus Stops**

Bus drivers must account for each pupil's safety before leaving them. Students should not leave the bus stop until the bus has departed. Please ask your child to follow the driver's instructions.

#### Alternate Stop Forms

Parents using the service of a local daycare or babysitter other than their home must fill out an Alternate Stop form each school year. The student must be at the same location either in the a.m. or p.m. five days a week unless you have submitted shared parenting papers (court order) giving us authorization.

This form is available online at lakelocal.org under 'Transportation,' or at your child's school.

#### **Bus/Route Communication**

All communications concerning transportation are to be directed to the Transportation office at 330-877-4275.



Lake Local Schools is introducing the ability to complete required student forms online, through the school website, for the 2016-2017 school year for the convenience of parents and our staff. We are starting this process by placing the following school forms online:

- Student Information • Emergency Medical • Over-the-Counter Medicine
- Contacts
- Media Release
- Residency Verification

To complete forms online, you will need access to the Internet, and you will need to create an account using your son's/daughter's student information (your child's first name and last name, and their student ID number - you should have received a district letter recently with this number). If you have multiple children, only one student's information is required to create an account. Your other children will be added to this account after the account has been created.

To access the online forms link, go to the Lake Local Schools website, <u>www.lakelocal.org</u>, and click on the Online Forms button located on the homepage of the website (left hand side, fourth blue button down under Quick Links). This button will take you to a webpage that will allow you access to the site to create an account and a document with step-by-step instructions on how to go through the process.

If you have problems or concerns completing your student's online forms, please review easy step-by-step instructions provided via a link on the online forms page, or contact your school building's main office.

The Free and Reduced Lunch Application can also be filled out through this online process as well. Login with the same account as you used for the above online forms. Click on the "Lunch Menu" button on the school website homepage, then click on the "lake.sdms2.com" link on the "Lunch Menus" page, and it will direct you to the online process. When submitting your application, you'll get instant notification regarding your eligibility status. This streamlines and expedites this application process tremendously.

If you have any problems or concerns completing the Free and Reduced Lunch Application, please contact the Food Service office at 330-877-4742.

Students are not permitted to change buses or travel home with a friend on their buses without prior written authorization. Request must be in writing from the children's legal guardian at least 24 hours in advance of the requested day. Request may be denied if the bus has the maximum students riding the requested bus. Many buses cannot accept additional students. Once students are on a school bus they are not permitted to leave that bus until they are transported to their assigned stop, unless authorization has been given by a school official. If there are health or special circumstances affecting your child that we should be made aware of, please contact the Transportation office.

## **Medication** Administration for **Students**

In preparation for the 2016-2017 school year, please read information below regarding medication administration to students within our district.

- All students receiving any medication at school must have the proper medication authorization form completed.
- All medications, including topical ointments, must be provided by the parent.
- Medication must be in the original container labeled with the students name and dosing instructions.
- · Prescription medications must be brought in prescription bottle with signed instructions form from the physician.
- It is advised that the medication form and medication be brought to the school by the parent/guardian.
- There must be notification to the school if there is any change in the mediation instructions.
- Please provide any other information that will help insure the proper and safe usage of the medication.
- It is the responsibility of the parent/guardian to retrieve any remaining medication at the end of the administration period (or school year). Any unclaimed medication will be disposed of prior to the next school year.


## **Grade Level Updates**

## *Uniontown Educators Receive State Awards*

Uniontown Elementary paraprofessional **Trish DiDonato** and second grade teacher **Ali DeGeorge** were recognized for their outstanding commitment to students during a conference in Columbus June 13, 2016. Mrs. Didonato was recognized as the *Ohio's Council for Exceptional Children's Outstanding Paraprofessional*, while Mrs. DeGeorge was named *Ohio's Council for Exceptional Children's General Educator of the Year*. They were selected based on their work with students with and without special needs in the classroom

"Mrs. DeGeorge has worked tirelessly to create a culture of learning and collaboration in the classroom and with her fellow teachers. As a leader, she has become an agent of change. She has led a grass roots approach that changed the way Uniontown Elementary services students. Due to her hard work and commitment to students with and without disabilities, students can learn in an open, supportive environment," began Uniontown Elementary Principal Frank Gant, who accompanied his staff members to the awards presentation in Columbus.

Mrs. DeGeorge has been employed with the district for 17 years, while Mrs. DiDonato has been a staff member for the past 19 years.



## Uniontown Elementary Receives All A Award

Ohio's State Board of Education recently granted Uniontown Elementary one of its first annual **All A Awards**. This recognizes schools that have received A's on every aspect of school performance measured on Ohio's School Report Cards.

As one of the first winners of this award, Uniontown Elementary is part of an elite group of schools that are demonstrating high quality teaching and leadership

that result in high academic performance for every type of student. "The All A's Award is presented by the State Board of Education and recognizes schools for receiving an "A" on every Ohio School Report Card measure. This award places your district among the top-performing ones in our state," added Allie Gellner, intern with the Ohio Department of Education.

"Members of the State Board greatly appreciate your leadership and the conscientious work of your teaching and support staff to bring about this great success. Please convey our thanks to your staff and parents for believing that every child can succeed and committing to make sure that every child does. Your school is a wonderful example for all Ohio schools," states a letter to Uniontown Principal Frank Gant from Thomas Gunlock, President of the State Board of Education.

**NOTE:** Lake Local's Hartville Elementary would also have received similar recognition during 2016 as an All A Awards school, except more than five percent of their entering kindergarten students were found to be "not on track" after a kindergarten state assessment administered last fall. "This kindergarten state assessment is a curious indicator, considering we have no control of the literacy capabilities of our students as they enter kindergarten," commented John McAllister, Lake's former Director of Instruction.

They disassembled electronics, saw what was inside, and tried to build their own inventions from the remnants. 
